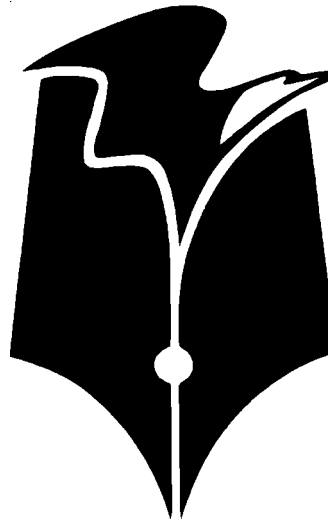

The 26th Annual PUBLIUS FELLOWS PROGRAM

An intensive four-week summer course in political philosophy and journalism designed for college upperclassmen and graduate students who are interested in writing for the public prints.

“Publius” was the *nom de plume* taken by James Madison, Alexander Hamilton, and John Jay as authors of the preeminent work of American political journalism, *The Federalist Papers*. His writing aimed and served “to refine and enlarge the public views” on the major political concern of his day, the ratification of the Constitution. In keeping with the great tradition of political journalism he inherited, Publius drew on the seminal works of political philosophy, the experience of past statesmen, and a profound grasp of existing circumstances to articulate the basis of free and just government in the New World.

Now in its twenty-sixth year, the Publius Fellows Program is dedicated to preserving the tradition of American political writing of which Publius is the noblest exemplar. It aims to foster constructive commentary on the important issues of our time, informed and moderated by an understanding of the philosophic and historical roots of American democracy.

During their four-week tenure, Publius Fellows will reside in Claremont. They will attend an intensive series of seminars on political philosophy and the American political tradition, and examine contemporary public policy in light of the principles of American constitutionalism. Some seminar sessions will be integrated with the Institute’s flagship publication, *The Claremont Review of Books*, and will focus on political journalism and writing skills. Each Fellow will write three pieces, including one op-ed and one book review, which will each be subjected to detailed criticism. Up to ten Publius Fellowships will be awarded.

- ◆ **The program runs from Sunday, June 13, through Saturday, July 10, 2004.**
- ◆ **Each Fellow will receive a stipend in the amount of \$2,000.**
- ◆ **Travel expenses of each Fellow will be provided for up to \$500.**
- ◆ **Lodging and some meals will be provided for each Fellow.**
- ◆ **The deadline for receipt of all application materials is March 12, 2004.**
- ◆ **Applicants will be notified of our decision by March 26, 2003.**
